

Gladstone Regional Council Community Development Strategy 2020-2025

Gladstone Regional Council is undertaking an important community project to create a five year Community Development Strategy and Action Plan to guide Council's focus for community development across the Gladstone Region.

You are invited to have your say on how Council can work with the community to build an engaged, involved and proud community.

Gladstone Regional Council aims to foster safe, healthy and inclusive communities. It does this by working alongside community groups, organisations, service providers and other levels of government on programs, infrastructure and services that aim to strengthen our community.

Council is seeking your input into this project to assist Council in establishing their approach to social priorities, community programs, social infrastructure, open space activation, networks and partnerships over the next five years.

Why are we developing the Strategy and Action Plan?

In 2018 Council transitioned to a new operating model and new Corporate Plan, setting a clear direction towards creating a stronger fabric of community connectedness, lifestyle and enhanced livability in the Gladstone Region.

With a reinvigorated vision of Connect, Innovate, Diversify, Council has set nine strategic goals which focus on 'fostering our region to be an engaged, involved and proud community'.

Council has always undertaken community development activities, however it has been recognised that some of these activities such as direct service delivery is better placed to be delivered by the human and social service sector. Council is now focused on engagement, partnerships and capacity building with, and alongside, the community.





The Community Development Strategy and Action Plan will guide Council's community development actions over the next five years. The Strategy will identify projects, priorities and programs for Gladstone Regional Council to implement in partnership with the community.

What is Community Development?

Community Development is about the way Council works with the community, associations, other levels of government and services to create strong sustainable communities.

Community Development is a process of strengthening communities and their capacity to develop active, sustainable and supportive environments in which people live and work. There is a specific dedicated community development team of staff at Council but all areas of Council contribute towards community development outcomes.

Some traditional examples for the Gladstone Regional Council have been a focus on youth and seniors, cultural diversity, inclusivity and reconciliation, community resilience in the event of a natural disaster, volunteers, open space activation, and active sports & recreation development.

Other community development activities that Council undertakes include the provision of programs, events and awards, grants programs and support to community groups and associations to grow their organisations. We also have specific plans such as the Reconciliation Action Plan and Cultural Plan which includes many community development activities which Council implements. Other activities include infrastructure planning and open space activation.
